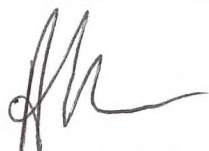

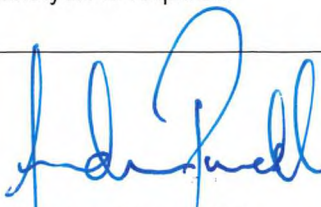
Proposal type	Details
Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	The proposal includes regulatory amendments to support the delivery of the single integrated permission for tourism activities on protected areas, State forests, recreation areas and State marine parks under the government’s 20-year tourism plan, <i>Destination 2045 - Delivering Queensland’s Tourism Future</i>. These amendments are deregulatory, and do not increase costs or regulatory burden on business or the community. No regulatory impact analysis is required under <i>The Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.

Minor and machinery in nature	The proposal includes complementary administrative amendments and minor corrective changes and clarifications, such as: • amendments to combine commercial activity agreements, consistent with the single integrated permission amendments; • clarifying the offence for dumping or abandoning waste in protected areas; • correcting minor errors or omissions regarding protected area permitting arrangements; • correcting the minimum aircraft flying heights over Carnarvon National Park and Currawinya National Park; and • reinstating a penalty infringement notice offence for the <i>Recreation Areas Management Act 2006</i> which was inadvertently removed in a previous legislative amendment process. The changes are minor and have zero regulatory costs. No further regulatory impact analysis is required.
