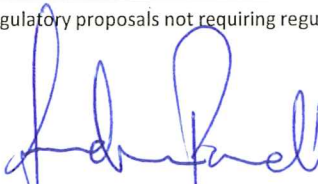

Proposal type	Details
Minor and machinery in nature	This amendment regulation proposes to redescribe four State forests to improve plan accuracy, revoke part of one State forest for road purposes, make additions to two national parks and redescribe two national parks to improve plan accuracy. All areas that are proposed to be dedicated as national parks are currently unallocated state land owned by DETSI. The regulatory amendment proposal is machinery in nature, consistent with regulatory best practice principles and the objectives of the <i>Forestry Act 1959</i> and the <i>Nature Conservation Act 1992</i>. This proposal is machinery in nature, to update schedules in the <i>Forestry (State Forests) Regulation 1987</i> and the <i>Nature Conservation (Protected Areas) Regulation 1994</i> and does not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy or new impacts on business, government, or the community.
