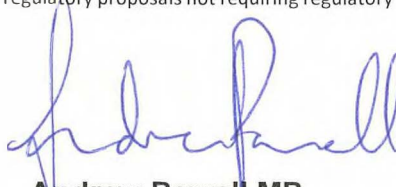

Proposal type	Details
Minor and machinery in nature	This amendment regulation proposes to redescribe and increase the area of two nature refuges and declare thirteen new nature refuges. One proposed nature refuge is leasehold land, and the remainder are freehold land, and all relevant parties under sections 45, 46 and 48 of the <i>Nature Conservation Act 1992</i> have been notified and, where relevant, consented to the nature refuge amendment. Landholders have been closely involved in the negotiation and development of their conservation agreement. The regulatory amendment proposal is machinery in nature, consistent with regulatory best practice principles and the objectives of the <i>Nature Conservation Act 1992</i>. This proposal is machinery in nature, to update schedules in the <i>Nature Conservation (Protected Areas) Regulation 1994</i> and does not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy or new impacts on business, government, or the community.
